Description of the applied methodology

The evaluation of the Pilot Sport Games Training Module will be done by collecting and analising evaluation forms distributed to all target groups during the trainings and after Youth Sport Fair Chance Games. The analised data will be used to generate indicators of success and relevance of the project. It will also serve as a tool for developin Guidelines.

The focus will be on the measures and recommendations aimed at increasing the level of awareness among all target groups (direct and indirect) an all key stakeholders on the importance of combat against violence, racism, discrimination and intolerance in sport. This should help decision makers at national, regional and local levels to develop promotion policies and to initiate efficient related international projects in the future, even on a larger scale, reaching people from all age groups. Guidelines draft will be given on the discussion and the revision to all project partners. Revised and accepted version will be presented in each country during the Final conference in Serbia (in the scope of 5th Transnational project meeting). Empowerment: Describe the specific impact generated by the	Through the project activities we will actively involve PE teachers and pupils in project activities through the development and implementation of educational materials, linking experts, exchanging examples of good practice, encouraging co-operation and preparing joint initiatives / projects / programs related to the prevention and combating of violence in sport and sport (before, during and after sports events), the fight against discrimination and intolerance and the promotion of tolerance and multiculturalism. The project aimed to identify, develop and compile sports-related best practices, which
project/programme in terms of empowerment	optimally contribute to the dissemination of messages of respect, the fight against discrimination and racism and the prevention of all forms of violence in sports.
	The project promoted sports values as a key element for the fight against intolerance, racism and other forms of discrimination, and draw attention to the relevance of sports for an integral development of youngsters.
	Sport is a human activity resting on fundamental social, educational and cultural values. It is a factor making for integration, involvement in social life, tolerance, acceptance of differences and playing by the rules. For many people, especially for young people sport is a part of their identity. Nowadays many sports are confronted with a great number of threats such as violence, racism, discrimination and intolerance. Those threats challenge the fundamental values of European political and cultural integration so there is a need for training of teaching professionals (e.g. physical education teachers) and coaches about the prevention of discrimination and violence in sport in schools and sports clubs.
	The project was focused on supporting the implementation of the EU policy regarding the strengthening of the prevention and fight against

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	racism and violence among youth in sport, in respect to a number of EU policies, guidelines and recommenda-tions such as White Paper on Sport through developing and compiling sports- related best practices dedicated to elementary school children and PE teachers and motivat-ing them to take part in project activities in order to raise their awareness on the im-portance of fight against any form of violence and discrimination in sport.
